RACE PACK PICK UP

Race pack pick up will take place at Scenic Reserve, pits area by the lake Sunday 24 July from 9am. This is when timing transponders and race numbers will be issued to riders.

All riders will be issued with a unique body number and two shoulder numbers. The two shoulder numbers must be attached to the front of the rider's arms just below the shoulder – see image below. The body number must be attached horizontally on the side (above the hip) that passes the timing tent (left hand side).





RACE BRIEFING

A race briefing for Riders and Team Managers will be held at 12pm on 24 July at the pits area by the lake. This is compulsory for all Riders and Team Managers (or alternative representative) to attend. The final safety briefing and race information will be communicated at this meeting.

PRACTICE

The course will be open to practice from 9am - 10am on Sunday morning. Please listen to the instructions of the commissaires during this time.

SPECTATORS

All racing is free for spectators to watch.

PARKING

Free parking is available in the venue carpark. The venue accepts no liability for any damage to any vehicles parked in or otherwise using the car parking area.

TENT SET UP

There will be a designated area to set up school tents.

ENTRY LIST

A live entry list is available here. Start Lists will be available once entries close.

SCHOOL AFFLIATION AND ENTRY FEES

All School Affiliation fees and Event Entry fees must be paid before riders are permitted to start the event. Race Packs will not be issued to schools who have outstanding fees. Please ensure you check with your school to ensure affiliation and payment has been made.

WITHDRAWING FROM THE EVENT

If withdrawing from the event, please ensure you tell a race official as soon as possible and return your timing transponder to the race office.

UNIFORMS

Correct school uniform must be worn. See <u>Cycling New Zealand Schools Rules</u> for more on Uniform Rules. Ensure you are compliant before you arrive at the event to avoid any unnecessary stress.

The requirements for uniforms is below:

A school racing uniform must be in the relevant school's colours and the logo or name of the school must be prominently displayed. In the event that a school does not have a school racing uniform riders shall race in plain cycling top and shorts which should as much as possible reflect the colours of that school.



RULES

The event is endorsed by School Sport New Zealand and is run under Cycling New Zealand Schools Rules.

Cyclocross bikes are recommended, however not mandatory. Refer to rules.

Unique cyclo-cross rules of note:

② A rider's race ceases when the **winner of their class finishes**, i.e. riders complete their current lap. Lapped riders continue to ride and finish only when the first rider in their class has completed the event.

RESULTS

Provisional results will be printed and posted on the Information board at the event.

Please note these are provisional and any queries are to be made by the Team Manager only directly to the Chief Commissaire. Any Protests are to be submitted in writing (see form at back of manual) and will be reviewed by the Disputes Panel

Final results will be posted to the event website as soon as possible after the event.

MEDAL PRESENTATIONS

Presentations will take place after the final race of the day. Placegetters must wear either their school kit or school uniform on podium. Remember that every rider who doesn't get a medal would love to wear your one, so respect the medal and do not take it off until you have resumed your seat.


SMOKE, DRUG AND ALOCHOL FREE
